## Timor-Leste

## SUMMARY

- The report published in 2011 improves on prior country reports. It is easily readable and includes company-by-company data.
- It shows zero discrepancies between company payments and government receipts. Future reports could improve further by providing production data and revenue figures for gas and oil separately.
- The report contains no materiality clause, but covers all companies and revenue streams.
- There is also no information on the required audit standards for data submitted by companies or government, though this can be found in the validation report.
- All petroleum revenues go into Timor-Leste's Petroleum Fund, and the latest EITI report provides a very useful reconciliation of differences between the revenue figures from the Fund and the EITI figures.
