



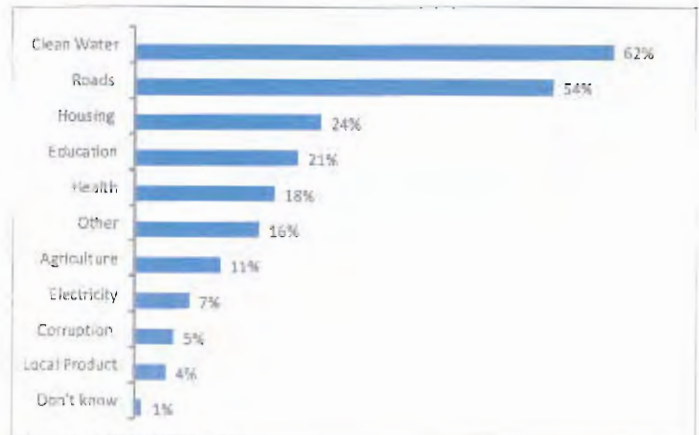
Timor-Leste Water Supply and Sanitation Sector Snapshot



- Sustainable Development Goal 6:** By 2030, achieve universal and equitable access to safe and affordable drinking water for all. Achieve access to adequate and equitable sanitation and hygiene for all and end open defecation, paying special attention to the needs of women and girls and those in vulnerable situations.
- Timor-Leste Strategic Development Plan 2011-2030:** By 2030, all citizens in Timor-Leste will have access to clean water and improved sanitation:
 - A safe piped 24-hour water supply to households in 12 district centers.
 - By 2020, 75% of Timor-Leste's rural population will have access to safe, reliable and sustainable water, and 40% of rural communities will have significantly improved sanitation facilities.

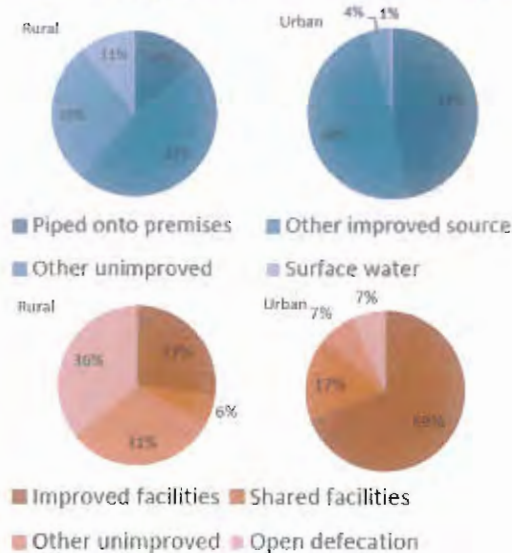

If you could meet the country's top leaders what would you want to express or ask them for?



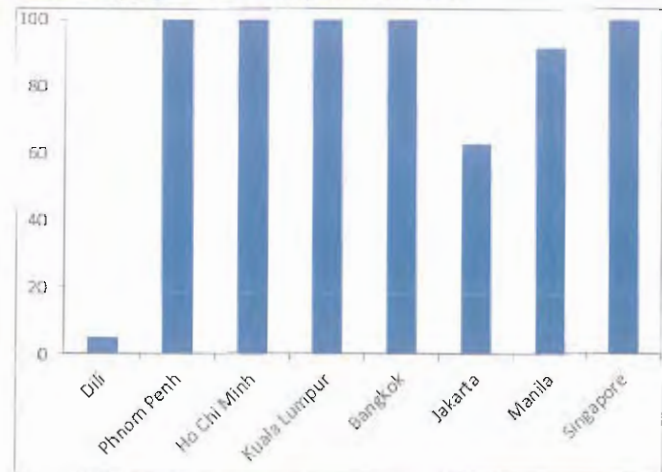

Water Supply and Sanitation Access in Timor-Leste



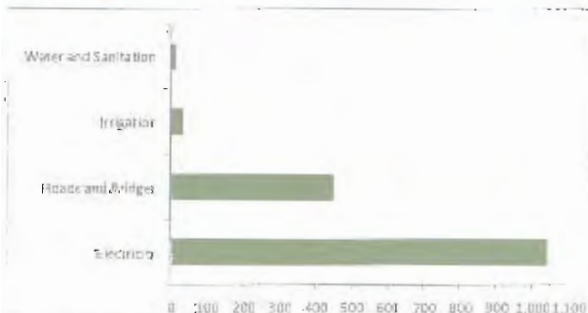

Proportion of Population with Access to a 24-hour Piped Water Supply: ASEAN City Comparison



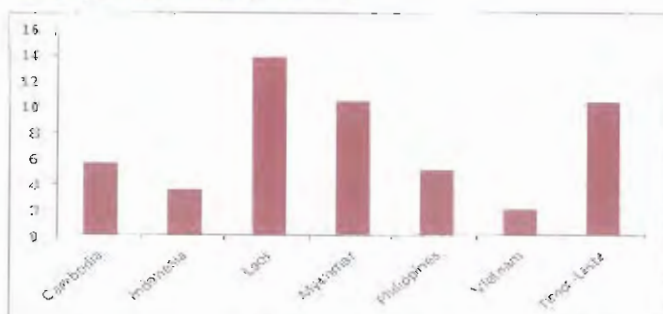
