“Ida-ne’e atu ko’alia ho ita nia parseiru dezvoltimentu sira atu haree ba dezvoltimentu Timor-Leste nian ba tinan lima ho baze ba ita nia Planu Estratéjiku Dezvoltimentu Nasionál, ne’ebé ita nia doador lubuk ida mak partisipa iha reuniaun ne’e hanesan Uniaun Europeia (UE), husi ASEAN nian, Oseania, Estadu Unidu Amérika (EUA), Japaun, Korea Súl, Xina no seluk tan, sira hotu prontu atu apoiu ita nia dezvoltimentu,” Ministru Bendito katak ba jornalista sira iha edifisiu Ministériu Finansa, Aitarak-Laran-Dili, sesta ne’e.

Timor-Leste’s Partnerships Development Meeting (TLPDM-Sigla Inglés) ne’ebé prezide hosi Primeiru Ministru (PM) RDTL Kay Rala Xanana Gusmão ho ho tema “Timor Asaun Planu tinan lima Governu Konstitusionál da-9 nian” sai hanesan plataforma ida hodi hatudu no diskute vizaun no prioridade estratéjiku Governu nian ba tinan lima oin.

TLPDM integra komponente prinsipál rua mak hanesan Sorumutu koordenasaun setoriál husi pilár Planu Estratéjiku Dezvoltimentu Nasionál (PEDN), no diskusaun plenária kona-ba planu Governu nian ba futuru, diálogo nivél áas dahuluk entre Governu Konstitusionál da-9 ho ninia parseiru dezvoltimentu sira dezde asume kna’ar iha fulan Jullu 2023.

Parseiru sira hanesan Asian Development Bank (ADB), International Finance Cooperation (IFC) no Banku Mundiál prontu nafatin atu tulun Timor-Leste hodi fó continuidade ba prosesu dezvoltimentu nasional.

“Enkontru ne’e hanesan mós instrumentu ida atubele halo avaliasaun, analiza kada tinan, atu nune’e Governu bele propoin planu asaun tuir mandatu liuliu iha Governu ida-ne’e nian atu ezekuta oinsa. Entaun parseiru dezvoltimentu espresa sira nia vontade di’ak atu apoiu nafatin ita,” nia afirma.

Parseiru dezvoltimentu hotu iha Timor-Leste kontente ho planu ne’ebé Governu iha liuliu hato’o husi Primeiru-Ministru, Kay Rala Xanana Gusmão, Vise Primeiru Ministru na’in-rua Asuntu Ekonómika no Asuntu Dezvoltimentu Rurál. Asuntu infrastrutura apresenta husi Ministru Planeamentu Investimentu Estratéjiku (MPIE).

“Iha ita nia apresentasaun durante enkontru TDPDM ne’e ita nia parseiru sira enfaze ba prosesu kooperasaun liuliu mekanizmu koordenasaun, nune’e aspeitu setoral bele la’o. Entaun ami hanesan Ministériu Finansa ho MNEK servisu hamutuk atu halo ajenda ka orariu. Nune’e bele iha diskusaun tematika hodi bele promove dezvoltimentu ita nian iha Governu ida ne’e ba tinan lima mai,” nia esplika.

Servisu hotu ne’ebé Governu halo hodi responde fazeadamente ho sistematika kona-ba nesesidade ba infrastrutura, kapasitasaun rekursu umanu, ekonomia, agrikultura, programa nutrisaun, edukasaun saúde no seluk tan.

## **Government to give priorities to health and education sectors in the coming years**

**DILI, 17 may 2024 (TATOLD)** – The Prime Minister, Kay Rala Xanana Gusmão, in his remarks at the 2024 Timor-Leste and Development Partners Meeting (TLDPM), said that the IX Constitutional Government’s priorities for the coming years are health and education.

Gusmão therefore said that the government will improve essential services in both sectors to ensure that the Timorese have access to quality education and good health services in the country.

“In the coming years, total priority will continue to be given to the health and education sectors, to improve these essential public services,” said Prime Minister at the Timor-Leste and Development Partners Meeting, at the Office of the Finance Ministry on Friday.

He said that the Government has approved the Integrated Health Plan, combining various health programs into a single plan to provide coordinated and comprehensive primary, secondary, and tertiary healthcare across the national territory: “We will create mechanisms to ensure universal health coverage, even in areas where access is more difficult, maximizing efforts and efficiency, transparency, and professionalism in the management of financial, human, material, and logistical resources, as well as health infrastructure and equipment.”

In the education sector, Gusmão said that his government will continue to work to ensure quality education for all children and young people, starting with the evaluation of teachers and the development of a Candidate Pool to fill vacancies and needs based on capacity and merit.

“We have also approved the Draft Law on the Higher Education Framework Law, which, after more than 14 years of the Basic Education Law coming into force, needed an update in light of the current demands and challenges of the country,” said Prime Minister.

He stressed that the training and capacity building of human resources is a necessity and a priority that cuts across all sectors of governance and I know that our Development Partners are aware of this.

“We know that people are the true engine of development, whether in increasing agricultural productivity, promoting tourism, growing entrepreneurship, adopting best practices and policies from infrastructure to the provision of social services, and even modernizing public institutions,” Gusmão added.

He said: “People – supporting people! From combating child malnutrition to improving school menus, from promoting and valuing women in the labor market and within communities to including and protecting the most vulnerable in our society.”

“People are our greatest asset, our greatest potential, our greatest hope for a sustainable future. That’s why, I say, our country also needs another type of major investment beyond Public-Private-Partnerships (PPPs), in other words, it needs partnerships for people!” Gusmão concluded.

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
