The Timor-Leste Root Cause Analysis Workshop & Closed Door Discussion

October 2-3, 2018

The goal of this workshop will be to discuss key challenges to economic growth that can be addressed in the compact between the Government of Timor-Leste and the Millennium Challenge Corporation (MCC). In December 2017, MCC selected Timor-Leste for a compact – a large, five-year grant program. As part of the compact development process, MCC and the Government of Timor-Leste have mutually identified the following binding constraints that limit private sector-led growth in Timor-Leste and are possible areas for the compact to address:

- Public Financial Management: Low sustainability and effectiveness of fiscal expenditures;
- Business Enabling Environment: Weak policies and institutions to enable market transactions; and
- Human Capital: Poor nutritional outcomes and lack of high skilled workers

The next step in the process is the root cause analysis workshop to discuss the key drivers of these constraints that could be addressed by the compact to unlock poverty reduction through economic growth. This analysis will serve as a critical bridge between the identification of broad binding constraints and the selection of specific issues around which proposed projects will be developed.

Day Two will be a closed door discussion between the Government of Timor-Leste and MCC to determine which priority areas the Government will propose for MCC to consider for the compact.
