

Council of Ministers – expropriation law, compensation fund law and the draft land

law

Policy situation to date...


- 2010: Council Parliament
 Ministers approve the laws
- 2012: Parliament approves the laws
- March 2012: Presidential veto
- June 2013: Approved by Council of Ministers
- Now awaiting parliamentary debate in the new year






State Pardadigm: Land Grab

'Reform of the law relating to land tenure is of crucial importance for long-term private sector development'

'Timor-Leste faces three types of land-reform challenges: farm land now under customary practices; urban land in need of zoning and clear property rights; and government land that can be used for public and private investment such as tourism or petroleum development.'
