1. Project / Activity Description

2. Physical, Biological and Social Impacts and Mitigation Measure

- Potential environmental impacts of the development, feasible and cost-effective measures to prevent or reduce such impacts to acceptable levels shall be specified through the construction and operating phases. Mitigation measures shall be clearly set-out within the framework of a full work plan and schedule.

3. Monitoring, Reporting and Auditing Schedule

- Specific arrangements, methods and procedures for inspection, monitoring and reporting during construction and operation phases of the project shall be prepared. Actual impacts as they arise and the effectiveness of proposed mitigation shall be documented. A schedule of periodic audits to inform the Environmental Management Plan (EMP) process shall be established.

4. Organization and Management Structures

- Responsibilities for implementation of all parts of the EMP shall be clearly assigned. Procedures which will act upon information gained during monitoring and audits shall be clearly specified.

5. Resources and Costs

- The resources necessary to implement an EMP shall be specified, as well as those responsible for making those resources available.

6. Capacity Building and Training

- Capacity building and training needs shall be identified to ensure that impacts can be properly managed, controlled, and can be implemented without cumulative or long-term impacts from the development. Staffing requirements and other supporting arrangements shall be identified to demonstrate capacity to implement the EMP.

7. Declaration of Compliance

- The EMP shall include a letter signed by the Contractor regarding its commitment to implement all mitigation measures and other provisions contained therein.
